The discussions of the universal themes within Macbeth inform the transactional writing skills needed for the Language paper 2, and the pythiad of linguistic and figurative devices used by Shakespeare enriches their own creative writing for Paper 1 of the language paper. Analysis and inference skills of Macbeth are transferred then to the unseen texts in the Language papers, as well as the unseen poems in the Literature paper.
