
SUNNYDOWN SCHOOL MUSIC CURRICULUM PLAN

Autumn 1	Musical Elements	Introduction to musical elements, listening to a range of different music genres, appraising them and using percussion instruments to play along.	Pitch Tempo Rhythm Dynamics Texture Timbre	 Building on Students will arrive at Sunnydown with hugely varying amounts of prior music learning. This unit aims to teach students how to be musically literate, regardless of their previous experience. Building towards Students will put their knowledge of the musical elements and of performance into instrumental work in their next topic. As a skills based subject each topic is designed to further develop the students' skills in performance, composition and appraisal.

Spring 1	World Music - African Drumming (Charanga SOW)	Students will learn how to perform on Djembe drums, as well as learning the role these drums play in African culture. Students will learn how to play in unison and how to play an independent part in an ensemble performance. Students will also learn how to create their own rhythmic compositions. Building towards this topic equips students with the basics of composition and performance skills. Spring 2	Soundscapes	Students will learn how to use music technology to compose their own melodic pieces in order to fit a given musical stimulus. Students will learn how music can be used to create and enhance particular moods and emotions.
