The Friday Curriculum

As we reach the final day of term before a well-earned two-week break, our commitment to your son's education remains as strong and focused as ever. This morning, I had the pleasure of visiting the many activities that form part of our bespoke **Sunnydown Friday Curriculum** and it was fantastic to see the enthusiasm and engagement of our students.

Year 8 students have been developing their mystery map skills and are now heading outside to continue their exploration. In RICE Skills, students have been creating Easter crafts and designs, while Year 9s have been working hard on our new allotment beds, carefully measuring and digging with great enthusiasm. Year 10 students have taken on different challenges - some are in Life Skills, while others have been competing in a Lego spacecraft design challenge against staff, with the competition currently too close to call! Our Year 11s have been making the most of a Maths clinic and a dedicated GCSE revision class, ensuring they are well-prepared for the forthcoming GCSE exams. Meanwhile, Year 7s are spending the morning at Kenley airfield, practising for their cycle challenge next term.

At the heart of our Friday Curriculum is the development of your son's communication skills, with a strong focus on building **resilience**, promoting **independence** and encouraging **cooperation**. Through our **Encouraged**, **Enabled**, **and Empowered** (**RICE**³) approach, we continue to support students in developing the skills they need to thrive.
