'Today is the 20th anniversary of the 7/7 London bombings - during which four bombers attacked central London, killing 52 people and injuring hundreds more.

At 08:49 BST on 7 July 2005, three devices were detonated on London Underground trains at Aldgate, Edgware Road and Russell Square.

A fourth device exploded on a double-decker bus in Tavistock Square an hour later.

Memorial services are taking place throughout the day to remember the victims - their families have been gathering at the scenes of the attack'
