I will write an extended message in due course, but wanted to offer the reassurance that I can regarding how the news was delivered today, and about the interim arrangements.

When I met with my SLT, it was agreed to deliver the news in the same way I have led the school for 11 years, with transparent honesty and respect for all concerned and with integrity. Waiting until after Year 11 had finished their exam, telling the young men in person and responding to their questions openly before lunch allowed an afternoon of support to be offered by my incredible staff team.

Telling my staff in person meant the world to me and though difficult, the sea of faces will remain with me as a memory I will cherish, not for sharing the news but in the realisation that I have created something very special; unique; here at Sunnydown, but this was only possible with the support of my colleagues. To them, again, thank you.

The interim arrangements will be well managed by Governors and my SLT in whom I have every confidence to manage in my absence. A Headteacher will be appointed in due course, but following a thorough recruitment process. I am confident that Governors will be in a position to provide further information over the course of the coming weeks.

To my Sunnydown families, thank you for the privilege of educating your sons, those that have already graduated, those about to, and those who will graduate in the future. I am confident in the impact I have made on each and every one of the young men, but again could not have achieved the outcomes we do, year in year out, without the support of families. Thank you.

I wish you all a wonderful weekend. To those who are able to celebrate the influence of our father figures on Sunday, I wish you a sensational day.
