A statement from Bailey Goodliffe with his reflection of Henry Webber (1849-1916).

Henry Webber was a Lieutenant in the 7th Battalion, South Lancashire and was known to be the oldest death in World War 1. Dying of wounds to the head by German shell at Mametz Woods, the Somme, France. Henry had 10 children, of which three were sent to war; all three of his sons lived. Henry Webber went to war because his sons were enlisted and all were drafted to France.

Henry Webber was born in Horley and lived in Horley, he attended Oxford University in 1867 and was a member of the stock exchange for over 40 years. Born in 1867 and died at roughly 6pm on the battlefield of the Somme on 21st July 1916.




Greenhouse Youth Board

SEND Dance Classes


