

#### **Mental Health**

Christmas is a very happy time of year, but to some this can be a very difficult time. Taking care of our Mental Health is extremely important to each and every one of us here at Sunnydown. Talking to one another and being able to explain our feelings can at times feel very difficult, which can mean we may need a little extra help. Attached is a document that gives information and numbers about Mental Health support both for young people and for families. Each charity has an area of expertise which means they will be able to support with any questions and give further support resources if needed. These charities also provide free crisis lines which can be used 24 hours a day, all year round. Mindworks also provides a free 24/7 mental health crisis line for children aged from six years, young people and their families/carers who are in crisis, the number for this is: **0800 915 4644**.

Here at Sunnydown we have invested in having two Learning Space practitioners to work with students and offer Mental Health support as well as working on other areas of need such as anxiety, anger, low levels of confidence and self-esteem, bereavement, bullying, friendships and family issues. This has been really successful and we are very excited that the two Learning Space practitioners Shawn and Lisa will be joining us again in January to offer sessions to a new group of students for the term. These sessions will be on a Wednesday and Thursday morning. Shawn will also be working with us for an extended afternoon, giving a bigger capacity for other students to receive sessions. Each student that will be receiving sessions will have been sent a consent form that will need to be returned prior to the sessions starting.
