The Sunnydown Cycle Scheme and Caterham Cycle Challenge

Introductory information

Sunnydown School in Caterham, Surrey, runs a cycle scheme where students are offered the opportunity to gain a cycle mechanic qualification as part of their curriculum.

Cycling gives a sense of freedom to the rider. Being able to maintain one's own bike whether at home or while out in the field adds a layer of confidence to the experience.

To launch our local scheme we had big plans. The original intention was to take a small group of students and staff to Australia and participate in The Gibb Challenge but Covid put this notion to rest. The Gibb Challenge involves cycling as soloist or as part of a team 660km over 5 days across the remote Kimberly region of Western Australia along the Gibb River Road. The event raises money for the Royal Flying Doctors Service. This is a mountain biking event like no other.

Not to be deterred by Covid restrictions, we now envisage our own (socially distanced and Covid Secure) Caterham Cycle Challenge, inspired by The Gibb Challenge.

As a school, we intend on cycling 660km using Kenley Aerodrome as the main circuit. Our event will synchronise with the Australian event, and as such will take place the week Friday 14th May to Friday 21st May.



The intention is for this to become an annual event and we still have the desire to take students to The Gibb Challenge in years to come.

The Gibb Challenge (<u>https://thegibbchallenge.com.au/</u>) is a fundraising event, with a majority of proceeds going to the Royal Flying Doctor Service (RFDS) in Australia. However, some proceeds do go towards your own chosen charity or organisation, and of course would have been our own cycle scheme.











As the current situation prevents our involvement in the Australian event, fundraising would still be involved in our Caterham Cycle Challenge.

This year, we would like to raise approximately £17,000 and donate this money to primary schools with CR3 postcodes to support their families who are eligible for FSM to purchase school shoes in September 2021.

Of any money raised in excess of this amount, a small percentage would be retained for our Cycle Scheme and the RFDS as our event will remain affiliated with The Gibb Challenge, especially since this was the inspiration for our event.
