Dear all who are associated with Sunnydown,

Today 7C learnt all about Ramadan and the Eid celebration taking place as Ramadam ends. Mrs Hull took the students on a trip to an Indian Sweet Shop in Wallington, where they sampled a selection of sweets. The owner of the shop very generously donated a box of sweets for the staff to share in celebration of Eid.

Ramadan is the Arabic name for the ninth month in the Islamic calendar. It is considered one of the holiest months for Muslims and is marked by a period of fasting, considered one of the Five Pillars of Islam.

The remaining four principles which Muslims believe are compulsory acts ordered by God include faith, prayer, charity and making the pilgrimage to the holy city of Mecca.

Ramadan falls on a different date every year, due to the cycles of the moon.

In 2023, Ramadan started on the evening of Wednesday 22 March, and will finish tonight, Friday 21 April.

If you want to wish someone well, you can say "Ramadan Mubarak", which means "Blessed Ramadan", or "Ramadan Kareem", which translates as "Generous Ramadan".

Muslims have an early morning meal before dawn, known as suhoor or sehri.

They do not eat or drink anything - including water - until they break their fast after sunset for the evening meal, called iftar or fitoor.

Eid takes place at the end of Ramadan.

The name "Eid al-Fitr" translates as "the festival of the breaking of the fast".

To all who are celebrating Eid this evening, Eid Mubarak.

These cultural experiences enhance our curriculum here at Sunnydown as we continue to educate ourselves and our students about the wider world.


