Last night we staff, mums and dads, grandparents, uncles, aunties, brothers, sisters and guests celebrated the achievement of our 2024 cohort - all listed below. Each and everyone one of them have undertaken an immense journey from that initial Year 6 to 7 transition, to the young men who wore suits and spoke as confident young men.

We were blessed to be in the company of Professor Martin Bushell - a graduate of Sunnydown 33 years ago. Martin is Professor of Cancer Biology at the Beatson Institute for Cancer Research in Glasgow. Martin had the privilege of awarding the Science Prize last night, awarded to Lucas Abrams. The prize was introduced and announced by Mr Cybuch.

The Governor's Prize, awarded in recognition for contribution to the Sunnydown school ethos and personal growth was introduced and announced by Mr Wright. Jamie Rogers was the 2024 recipient and the prize was awarded by Carla Berlin and Tamsyn Hendry - two of our committed governors.


Congratulations to 10D for achieving 100% attendance during the week ending 14th June.
