Dear all who are associated with Sunnydown,

Good morning - A Monday edition today, summarising all that happened last week.

With over 62% of our £17,000 target raised as part of the Caterham Cycle Charity, I am looking forward to seeing that increase even further this week as student donations and sponsorships start to flow in. Local primary schools will also no doubt be making a contribution.

By way of a reminder, for every £20 raised, students receive an entry into a draw to win a new bike. The more money raised, the more chances to win. Cash can be brought to school, clearly labelled. Alternatively, families can add directly to the Just Giving Page and clearly identify their son - tickets will then be allocated accordingly. The draw takes place the first week back after half term.

Wednesday 19<sup>th</sup> May saw the major sponsor breakfast in our landscaped sensory garden area, with a sausage and bacon breakfast cooked on our open fire pit. Via live video link, Josh Quigley in Scotland was able to give us a first hand update regarding the recovery of his knee, an injury sustained during his most recent world record attempt. Also, Simon Rimmer and the Gibb Challenge cyclists in remote Home Valley Station Western Australia described how the Royal Flying Doctors Service had to fly his wife 2,500km to the nearest hospital for emergency surgery while on the Gibb ride several years ago.

Thank you to Josh Barnes and James Hall and their respective families for joining me outside of Waitrose at the weekend, promoting the event and raising money. We were supported by an inflatable unicorn this week and it certainly helped draw a crowd.

Year 7 cycle this Friday 28th May, following the high wind postponement from last Friday.

Year 11 are working hard to ensure their folios of evidence are as full and complete as possible this week, before sitting some tests the week after half term. Teachers at Sunnydown are following the official JCQ and Ofqual guidance very carefully to ensure that the Teacher Assessed Grades (TAG) are warranted and can be justified.

No decision regarding the format for Year 11 graduation on Friday 18th June has been made yet, though current lockdown restrictions, though easing, may be the deciding factor.

I was notified late last week that the SCC consultation regarding the potential removal of boarding from Sunnydown will go ahead. Those who have responded should feel that they are being listened to - it was based on feedback to the informal consultation, among other factors, that required SCC to consider very











carefully the next step. I have been reassured by officers involved in the process that all voices will be heard and that the final decision is made by a lead Cabinet member. Important dates are below. As soon as I have any further information, including how to be involved in the formal consultation, I will share with the wider school community.

- Statutory (Formal) notice will be published on 26/05/21
- Statutory (Formal) consultation will run 26/05/21-30/06/21
- Lead Cabinet member decision 13/07/21

With the weather improving through the week, just in time for half term, I wish one and all a safe and happy end to the half term.
