Mrs Ogle won the National Award for Art Teacher of the Year, and I have shared below the original nomination. Huge congratulations Mrs Ogle - from the entire Sunnydown Community. The nomination was made from a valued Teaching Assistant, Miss Adams.

I would like to nominate Rachel Ogle for the forthcoming Unique Art Awards 2023. I feel that she really does go 'above and beyond' her normal teaching duties. Rachel works at Sunnydown School which is a specialist school that caters for students that have communication and interaction needs; these things can also be associated with autism. Rachel is Head of the school's Art department. The students all enjoy the various projects that are on offer, this includes a 'Lunchtime Art Club' where she often uses her own lunchtimes to accommodate our students.

Various activities such as digital art, sketching, painting and even clay modelling are offered to pupils, amongst various other exciting projects, as well as formal GCSE qualifications. She has recently managed to facilitate a BTEC for the Creative Media department which she also helps to run and manage. There really is nothing that she wouldn't do to help anyone. Rachel really is a ray of light and takes everything in her stride. She is always looking at ways to improve the Art department and regularly stays late with tidying, marking or arranging school trips. Rachel feels the importance of art trips is to enrich the lives of her students. They have recently visited the Tate Modern in London and the Horniman Museum which was enjoyed by both KS3 and KS4 students.

Rachel really is an exceptional teacher and nothing is ever too much for her to do. She is kind and wears her heart on her sleeve. Her main priorities are always the interests of the students, enabling them to exceed their own expectations. Rachel has been so busy nominating her art students for the unique art awards that I personally wanted to vote for her. There is so much more that I could list but words could never do this teacher justice, this is the reason why I have nominated Rachel for the Unique Art Award.
