Duke of Edinburgh Award

We are happy to announce we are running DofE courses for Years 9-10 at Sunnydown. The focus is for students to decide on their own activities and interests to design a programme that works for them.

The DofE award is a nationally recognised award that has four elements. There is a residential, which we will run as part of the students' outdoor activities; a physical element which we can sign off in PE and Games lessons, a skills element that could be music, cooking, bike mechanics or something else and a volunteering section. This could be things like helping Mr Bright maintain the school bikes, taking part in additional tutored lessons outside the school day, supporting lunch clubs or volunteering externally if students so chose.

We and the DofE are very flexible and supportive and the focus is to help students succeed. If they can bring passion and hard work we will recognise it.
