Dear all who are associated with Sunnydown,

Staff who were able to attend or support in the kitchen included Miss Thompson, Miss Tattershaw, Miss Lawson, Mrs McCarthy, Miss Derrig-Adams, Miss Adams and Mrs Austin. A wonderful opportunity to reflect on the benefits of working together. Thank you to Kelly Barnes and the entire team of FoS who pulled together another memorable event.

When mentioning memorable events, the Careers Morning on Thursday deserves recognition. Thanks to Ben Wright, who leads our KS4 careers development at Sunnydown, a variety of businesses from Merlin Group, to MetroBank, local accountancy and computer firms, various charities and even marketing firms were in attendance. They were treated to a hearty breakfast prepared by Sean and his team in the kitchen but also to the aspirations of many of our students. Cameron Castle and Adi Dasbiswas astounded the audience with their respective presentations on how the school supports career development for all students. The remainder of the young men including Ben Watts, Ben Goffin, Morgan Carew, Harry Monkhouse, Matthew Young, Daniel Linney, Henry Hilton, Cam'ron Pindi and Alex Hennessy then gave their plan A, Plan B and in some cases more, for their careers. To further enhance our careers support, three teaching assistants are undertaking training to be able to offer even more support to your son in preparation for life after Sunnydown. Many thanks to Katie Tattershaw, Lynne McCarthy and Claire Brooks for taking this on.

Regarding careers, our next event is the Year 9 and Year 10 careers evening on the evening of Wednesday 25th March. Attending this allows you and your son access to many Surrey colleges and post Sunnydown provision.

We also have our Inset day on Friday 20th March which coincides with the inaugural golf day. Your support in attending the evening meal, playing golf, and promoting the event is appreciated. Your efforts and attendance only benefit your son.

Reflecting on the dedication of my staff team as outlined above, I am aware of many other examples of where staff go above and beyond to attempt to accommodate the needs of your son. Please do reflect on this with your son, encouraging them to respect the staff and their efforts, and to talk politely at all times. Young men who speak politely and respect the efforts of staff are always recognised, and those who do not, will always be addressed.

Our Student Council is chaired by Cameron Castle. Cameron asked Mr Lord for permission to address the school on Monday to remind everyone of the importance of this group, and the potential it brings to influence positive change. This group supports the need for all young men to speak politely as outlined above. They have also been exploring the use of Chromebooks on behalf of the school.











I will write more formally to all families regarding Chromebooks prior to Easter, however I am sharing a brief update here. I am committed to providing opportunities for our young men to be as prepared as possible for the stages of their life after Sunnydown. This includes access to technology. For an extended period of time I have mentioned in the weekly newsletter and surveys the intention of introducing Chromebooks for each student, with parent contributions. We have started to collect quotes for these devices so that all of KS3 have their own device from September 2020. Hayleigh Rogers, the School Business Manager is developing a payment schedule for families so that the cost of these devices can be spread out, if necessary. It is important to realise that the device, when paid for, is yours. The cost will be approximately £285 and a vast majority of parents who responded to surveys about this have said they would be willing to support this scheme. Of course, if your family are in receipt of Pupil Premium, the school is in a position to support with funding.

At this point, I am not anticipating the scheme moves into KS4 from September 2020. Those students will continue to access the school bank of Chromebooks. Should a KS4 family wish for their son to have their own Chromebook, please do contact Hayleigh Rogers to discuss the purchase of this. All future students will then have a new Chromebook when they arrive and keep it when they leave, once paid for.

A Coronavirus update will be emailed this afternoon. By way of reminder, Public Health England is the guidance to which we as a school will reflect. All information relevant to schools published by PHE has been shared with families and will continue to be. All young men and staff have been encouraged to wash their hands thoroughly and to dispose of tissues appropriately.

Landscaping Project – timber for the roof over the giant chess set has arrived and this will go on in the near future. Paving to the BBQ Hut is almost complete. Final coats of varnish need to be applied to the floor to protect them, and then lessons will commence in the hut. Many thanks are extended to Mr Moody, Miss Collings and all of the young men who have contributed to this exciting project. Employers and business people who attended the networking breakfast on Thursday were incredibly impressed, and continued to repeat that these skills and experiences are what they are looking for in interviews. They challenged us and the young men to continue to explore exciting ways to provide even more opportunities to compliment out very successful landscaping, Burger Van and Cycle Mechanics Scheme. We will.

Regarding our landscaping project, if you know of anyone who has second hand metal garden gates they would like to donate to a worthy cause, we would happily accept them. We would be using them as scaffolds for climbing plants and screens rather than as gates. This will add to the decorative and aesthetic appeal of our areas.

It has been an exciting week at school with pupils engaging with career related learning in several curriculum areas. They have been discussing their aspirations, the myriad of employment opportunities and the skills and qualities required for the roles.

KS3 Friday Curriculum – (13/03/20)

Friday curriculum activities are usually scheduled to take place during the morning, with students returning in time for lunch. All students should arrive at school in uniform, and if required, change into alternative clothes here at school. Students will then change back into uniform once the activity is finished, in time for lunch, PSHE and the journey home. If an activity is scheduled to last longer than the morning session, this will be communicated with families by the coordinator of that activity.

Alternative clothing, as mentioned in the table, should be appropriate to the time of year. In wet and muddy conditions it is highly recommended your son brings a plastic bag to put their clothes in, following the activity. Labelled clothing is easier to return to the right person.

Class	Activity	Information
Year 7	Performing Arts	The boys will be working with Mr Quartermaine from Pro Corda and Mrs Jensen on some music and performing arts activities. The boys will need to be in school uniform.
Year 8	Outdoor Adventurous Activities.	The boys will be going to Blacklands Farm for some team building and confidence activities including tunnelling and the zip-wire. The boys will need to arrive at school in full school uniform and bring a change of clothes appropriate for outdoor (and potentially muddy) activities.
9W	School Projects (Mr Moody)	The boys will be working on school projects with Mr Moody and should wear school uniform to school and be prepared with a change of clothes that can be worn, should the weather allow outdoor landscaping projects. Wellington boots are available but students are welcome to bring their own. Students are expected to change into school uniform after the activity, in time for lunch, PSHE and the journey home.
