Dear all who are associated with Sunnydown,

Thank you all for your understanding of the delay in the newsletter this week.

I was at a meeting on Friday with the other Headteachers from specialist schools from across Surrey, hence the delay. We had the privilege of welcoming Claire Coutinho (MP for East Surrey) to discuss wide ranging aspects impacting on education in our sector including funding, Ofsted including the inspection regime, the LA outcome and the coroner's report into the impact of a Headteacher earlier this year, parent complaints, pay issues for Surrey staff and even the process of academisation.

Year 11 were busy last week and again this week with their practice exams. We continue to learn a great deal about how best to support each young man to achieve the best results possible. I am pleased to report that on the whole, most students in Years 7 to 10 have cooperated by keeping the school calm for the most part.

However, as more Year 11 students require additional support, this reduces the number of staff to be available to teach other students. With illness also keeping some staff away, I am mindful that during the actual Year 11 exam period in May and June, that the school may need to close to certain year groups to ensure we have enough staff to manage exams but also the remainder of the school.

On Thursday morning, all students are given £10 of Sunnydown money to spend on gifts for their family and friends. This wonderful initiative, managed by the Friends of Sunnydown, is a great way for the boys to be part of the fun of giving at this special time.

As we approach the Christmas break, I am looking forward to having our traditional meal on Thursday where the entire school eats at the same time. This is a huge undertaking by the kitchen team and in advance of another hearty and festive meal, many thanks are extended to the kitchen staff.

Following lunch, all students and staff assemble in the gym for 'Sunnydown's Got Talent' before a short session in form rooms. The acts in previous years have been exceptional, and I expect nothing less this year.

Friday is an early finish with lunch served between 12.30 and 1.20pm as is usual. Taxis will be called from 1.20pm with students being in their Form room to review a gift to take home from the school. Students have been told they are able to negotiate with their Form tutor and age appropriate movies for the morning session.

The student report read through was conducted during the last two lessons today. These opportunities allow the boys to reflect on their learning, their classroom readiness, and their progress, recording their comments. All reports are scheduled to be sent home on Thursday and Friday of this week.
