Students will be encouraged to drink plenty of cool water, stay out of the sun, wear sunscreen if outdoors and minimise strenuous exercise. Air conditioning will be on in all of Forest View so learning can continue in comfort.

Though uniform checks will continue (particularly shoes), **ties are not necessary for the duration of the week.** Students will be reminded that it is likely to be too warm for jumpers and blazers.

Our curriculum structure and offer has undergone a focussed review over the past 12 months, a process that we actually started in September 2019 only to be halted by Covid. I intend on sharing the latest developments prior to the end of term and am confident that you will appreciate the efforts in continuing to enhance our offer at our wonderful school.
