

Our policies and procedures set clear and high expectations regarding how students and adults should behave and interact. These policies include, but are not limited to, the Acceptable Use Policy (AUP) which outlines the safe use of electronic devices and social media. Safer Internet day was on Tuesday of this week.

An important aspect of Safeguarding training delivered across the country to all schools is to constantly remind one another that keeping children safe is everyone's responsibility. As our staff are incredibly vigilant to changes in eating habits, changes in behaviours, increase in language which might cause concern, interactions with other students, we hold a great deal of observational data. When these observations raise a level of concern, it is most likely that one of our Designated Safeguarding leads (DSL) will reach out and discuss this with you. These supportive conversations are to inform and to secure that partnership working that will clarify and resolve matters quickly, and where necessary allow access to the right support.

The weather next week for half term looks mixed. However, with a strong and positive mindset, whatever you do and wherever you are, you can create positivity.
