Dear all who are associated with Sunnydown,

We have been inundated with interest regarding the fishing trip on Thursday 3rd April. For the 12 spaces available, we have had 29 applications. Those students selected for Thursday 3rd April will be notified on Monday.

Because of the level of interest, I have approached the Masonic Fishing Charity and they have offered us a second date in September or October. So, while many students may not go next week, there will be another opportunity relatively soon.

During assembly today, I had the privilege of handing out House Point certificates, as well as those listed towards the end of this newsletter. Celebrating success is so important as a way of recognising progress. Congratulations to all who received certificates. To those who did not, I also extend my gratitude for your ongoing efforts to learn more every day. Thank you.

I took the opportunity to remind students and staff that while I lead Sunnydown School, I will work hard to ensure that all students and staff are safe and welcome. I asked for support in two areas.

The first was regarding how we speak with one another. I referred to the fact that like them, I am biologically a male. That does not give me the right to speak to a female in a way that might indicate I am better than them. I reminded the students that 85% of our staff are women and they deserve to be treated with respect by male staff and all students, as do the male staff.

The second area that I discussed was appropriate physical contact. I explained that shaking hands was completely acceptable. However, punching, kicking, poking and tripping were not acceptable. I also reminded students of the underwear rule - that an area of another person's body covered by underwear is not ours to touch, unless we are in an appropriate consenting relationship with that person.

These are important messages to share and discuss so that we have clear expectations regarding how we should behave. I appreciate your support in reminding our young men of these expectations.

We have recently recruited some new staff including Mr Bright as a TA. Mr Bright has a keen interest in cycles so students will see him in all subjects, but particularly in bike mechanics. Mr Cousins has been employed for a short window of time as a Science Lab technician. Mr Cousins has completed his Masters in Science and is waiting to see what his next steps are, including a possible Doctorate. I will include further summaries of new staff next week, as well as an updated list of my team.
