# tutelage

Say: toot - el - idge

instruction, teaching, guidance

- First recorded around 1595–1605.
- Comes from the Latin word *tūtēl(a)*, “guardianship,” which derived from the Latin verb *tuērī*, “to watch.”
- Related is *tuition*, “a charge or fee for instruction” or “teaching or instruction.”
